

# Faith Presbyterian Church 2009 Bible Reading Calendar

Including daily readings covering the whole Bible in one year

The Bible reading plan found in this calendar is thematic in approach. The idea is to make as many connections as possible between different parts of the Bible, while still reading individual books from start to finish. (Additionally, an attempt has been made to align the readings with some of the prominent days of the church year, such as Easter and Pentecost.) Only the Psalms are not read through consecutively; instead, they are apportioned throughout the year. Many of the Psalms (although not all) contribute something to the other reading or readings for the day. A few examples:

Jan 1 Gen 1:26 and Psalm 8:4-8: man is given dominion over the animals

Jan 6 Melchizedek as a type of Christ (all three readings)

Jan 10 Abraham's faith in offering Isaac (Heb 11 and Gen 22)

Jan 11 Gen 25 and Heb 12: Esau sells his birthright

Feb 12 Ex 34 and 2 Cor 3:7-13: Moses' shining face veiled

Feb 23 Lev 19:2 and 1 Pet 1:16 – you shall be holy, for I am holy

Apr 1 Zeph 1:1-6 and 3:1-20 with Luke 13:34-35: judgment on Jerusalem, followed by its restoration

May 23 Compare Psalm 131 with Mark 10:14-15

May 31 Pentecost readings – Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:16-21

June 3 The death of Achan in Joshua 7 and the deaths of Ananias and Sapphira in Acts 5 for deceit

July 14 2 Sam. 11 and Psa. 51: David's capital sins and his confession of that sin

July 28 Prov. 7's counsel to stay away from the strange woman, and 1 Ki. 11: Solomon's failure to follow his own advice, and the pain that followed

Sept 4 Job's happy ending (Job 42, James 5)

Oct 1 God as Shepherd and his people as sheep: all three readings

Oct 25 Hab 2:4 and Rom 1:17 – the righteous man will live by faith (read on Reformation Sunday)

Nov 24 Nahum (judgment on Nineveh, the capital of Assyria) with Isaiah 37's disaster for the Assyrian army and the assassination of the Assyrian king at Nineveh

Dec 3 The new heavens and new earth described in both Isaiah and Revelation

Dec 9 Haggai and Matt 6:25-34: seeking the kingdom of God first

There are many other connections to be found in this Bible reading plan, but these should be enough to demonstrate the desired aim.

Although this plan is meant to be read in one year, do not be discouraged if you fall behind. The main reason for this and other Bible reading

plans is to encourage you to feed on the Word of God on a regular basis. However, each person finds himself in different circumstances. One person may have the time, resources, and energy to read the Bible through three times or more in a year; another may need a much longer time frame to cover a single trip. Reading through the Bible within a certain period of time is not important. What is important is that you progress in your knowledge of God as you prayerfully study His Word. John Chrysostom put it this way: "To get the full flavor of an herb, it must be pressed between the fingers. It is the same with the Scriptures; the more familiar they become, the more they reveal their hidden treasures and yield their indescribable riches." Charles Spurgeon voiced a similar sentiment: "Some people like to read so many Bible chapters every day. I would not dissuade them from the practice, but I would rather lay my soul asoak in a half a dozen verses all day than rinse my hand in several chapters."
